Adjective

An adjective is a word that describes nouns and pronouns. It can be simply descriptive.

Example: The new house is now complete.

- A) An adjective can be used to classify things. E.g Here are the Siamese cats and there is the Burmese cats.
- B) An adjective can be used in numbering. E.g There are nine boxes on the shelf.
- C) An adjective can also be used to compare things. E.g Pita has the largest collection.
