### NARRATIVE ESSAY

A Narrative Essay tells a story. It talks about a particular event and describes the kind of experience that you got from it. In other words, you have to write about what happened to you and how it influenced you.

That is why writing narrative essay is the easiest assignment there is. Still, it is always better to have some sense of direction.

You must ensure to include all the conventions of storytelling: plot, character, setting, climax and ending. Below I have presented a sample narrative essay with a plan. Study the sample and attempt the question given in your writing book in the personal writing section. Remember narrative essay has been covered from Year 9 and this is a recap on narrative essay.
