



WHAT ARE POLLUTANTS?

- ✓ A substance that pollutes something, especially water, air, land or the atmosphere.
- ✓ They can be physical or chemical.
- ✓ They involve liquid, smoke, gases or heat.
- ✓ They are mostly the waste product or their by-products.
- ✓ The pollutants cause an adverse effect on the environment.
- ✓ The increase in concentration of carbon dioxide and the decrease in the concentration of oxygen also cause pollution.
- ✓ The pollutants are classified into different types and they depend on the form, existence and the natural disposal.
- ✓ Liquid waste such as oil spill from factories, industries and ships in the sea cause water pollution.
- ✓ Dangerous gases from vehicles and industries cause air pollution.
- ✓ Disposal of rubbish or waste incorrectly on land causes land pollution.
- ✓ Loud and unnecessary noise causes noise pollution.
