Dear students, we will learn the leftover two types of sentences in this worksheet.

Complex Sentence

A complex sentence has an **independent clause** (complete idea) and one or more **dependent clause** (incomplete idea).

Dependent clauses begin with subordinate conjunctions or relative pronouns.

<u>Subordinate Conjunctions examples</u>: after, although, as, because, before, even if, even though, if, once, rather than, since, so that, than, that, though, unless, until, when, whenever, where, whereas, while, whether

<u>Relative pronoun examples</u>: that, which, whichever, who, whom, whoever, whose, whosoever, whomever

Example of complex sentences:

1. Although my friend begged me,	I chose not to go to the reunion.
dependent clause	independent clause
subordinate conjunction	

Compound – Complex sentence

A compound-complex sentence has **two independent clauses** and at least **one dependent clause**.

Examples:

- 1. After the two soccer players lost their game, they joined their other teammates for lunch, and they went to the movies. If we remove the dependent clause "after the two soccer players lost their game," we have a compound sentence. The dependent clause makes this sentence compound-complex.
- 2. The man believed in the system, and he knew that justice would prevail after the murderer was sent to jail.
