Scope & Content: - <u>Tradition & Democracy</u>

- └ Fiji is unique in the sense that it has its own tradition and culture which governs the various chiefdoms.
- □ Through the arrival of the European missionaries, traders and settlers they brought with them a new government system.
- L This type of government system materialized with the ceding of Fiji to Great Britain.
- L Through our independence in 1970 Fiji went through democratic rule and the practice of democratic values.

1987 Election

- □ The 1987 election was won by the National Federation Party in which they formed a coliation with the Fiji Labour Party.
- ightharpoonup Doctor Timoci Bavadra was sworn in as Prime Minister on the 13th of April 1987.
- L This democratically elected government came to an end to the coup which was led by Major Sitiveni.Rabuka.

Multi-Party Government

- ∟ A multi-party government is a government which is made up of more than one party.
- △ As such, a manifesto will not be a priority to a multi-party government; the nation's need is usually the priority.
