Constitutional Development: -

- A constitution is an important document for a self-governing country and it sets the rules and regulations that guide a country on how it should be run.
- Fiji has had four constitutions ever since it became independent in 1970.

1970

- •Fiji became independent.
- •1970 constitution was abrogated in 1987 coup.

- •Fiji promulgated a new constitution.
- •1990 Constitution was not accepted by many with and outside of Fiji.

1990

- •1990 Constitution was reviewed.
- •Major changes came in 1997 in which a Constitution was promulgated.

1997

- •1997 Constitution was abrogated.
- •New Constitution was promulgated in 2013.

2010

There was a period of confusion and bitter debate when Great Britain unexpectedly indicated that it would grant independence to Fiji.

Main Features of the 1970 Constitution

Principles & Provisions

- The 1970 Constitution gave priority to *i*Taukei interests.
- The 1970 Constitution also had a communal electoral system which means that people vote for candidates from their own ethnic group.
- This is not to say that the electoral system was purely communal because people from other ethnic groups could vote for candidates of another ethnic group.
- The 1970 Constitution did not guarantee that any one ethnic group would gain a majority of seats in parliament.
