

Observable features of plants

Plants have stems, roots, flower, fruits and leaves.

Plants are different in colour, size and shape

Stem – able to support the plant, leaves and flowers.

Leaf - hold the plants in the soil. It carries water through stem to leave.

Flower – makes fruits

Fruit – produces seeds.


Observable features of animal for survival.
