The current that day was very strong as it was raining for the whole week. After playing for about thirty minutes, the boys decided to return home. Just as Timoci was swimming towards the river bank, his leg got stuck on a log. He gasped for breath but to no avail. Akuila seeing what was happening to his friend, screamed for help, while Jone was trying to help Timoci. Luckily Akuila"s dad heard them and rushed to the river. He brought Timoci to the river bank and performed CPR on him. Thankfully, he survived the **ordeal**.

Below is the procedure that Timoci"s dad used.

ARTIFICIALRESPIRATION

- 1. Clean the **air passage** by turning the head sideways and **inserting** a finger in the mouth.
- 2. Hold the **victim**'s nose with the thumb and the first finger. Pull the head backwards.
- 3. Take a deep **breath** and blow gently into the victim's mouth.
- 4. Look, listen and feel breathing. See if the **abdomen** and chest rise and fall.
- 5. Continue breathing into the victim if they do not start breathing on their own.

PARTS OF EYES AND EARS AND ITS CARE


1. Eat lots of fruits and veggies! Carrots, loaded with beta carotene are especially helpful in maintaining healthy eyes.

2. Avoid wearing contact lenses for more than 19 hours. This can cause permanent sight damage as well as extreme discomfort to your eyes. Don't wear glasses too long either.

3. Use cucumber on your eyelids. Press cold cucumber slices gently against eyelids 10 minutes before going to sleep at night to prevent puffiness.

4. Try not to spend so much time looking at your computer screen. The glare from the screen is said to weaken the muscles of the eye.

5. Exercise your eyes, and also be sure to relax them




CARE FOR THE EARS:

1. Wipe your outer ear with a damp washcloth every day when washing your face or taking a shower. Wipe gently to avoid irritating or breaking the delicate skin on your ears.

2. Avoid putting anything into your ears, including cotton swabs, tweezers or other sharps objects. Pushing objects into your ears may damage or rupture your eardrum.

3. Have your ears checked regularly by a doctor, and learn the warning signs of hearing loss.

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

Construction of how a circuit works



1. The diagram above shows a simple circuit of a flashlight with a battery at one end and a flashlight bulb at the other end.

2. When the switch is off, a complete circuit will not exist, and there will be no current.


3. When the switch is on, there will be a complete circuit and a flow of current resulting in the flashbulb

emitting light.

ELECTRICITY FLOW


How can we find out whether electricity is flowing in a circuit?

- 1. We can use a torch bulb as a circuit tester.
- 2. A lit bulb shows that electricity if flowing and that the circuit is closed.




A closed circuit – there is a complete pathway for electricity.

3. An unlit bulb shows that no electricity is flowing thus the circuit must be open



An open circuit – there is break in the pathway. Electricity cannot flow through.
