LESSON NOTES

INDUSTRIES - is used to cover all forms of economic activity: primary, secondary (manufacturing and construction); and services.

TYPES OF INDUSTRIES

Primary /Extractive	Secondary/ manufacturing	Tertiary/ Service
Deals with extraction of resources from nature 1 st stage of production Eg. farming, fishing, mining and forestry	Deals with changing the raw materials into finished goods. -2 nd stage of production Eg. Construction, milling, Garment Factory.	Deals with provision of services and selling of goods and services -3 rd stages of production Eg. Supermarkets, banking, transport, tourism.

FACTORS AFFECTING THE LOCATION OF MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY

1. Raw Materials – industries are located close to raw materials, mainly because the raw materials were heavy and costly to move.
2. Power supplies – early industry tended to be located near to sources of power because they could not be moved.
3. Transport – transport networks have improved with the building of roads, and methods of handling goods have become more efficient through containerization.
4. Markets – industries will locate near to markets if: The product becomes more bulky with manufacture and if product becomes perishable after processing
5. Labour supply and Capital
