LESSON 6/7/8: COMMON ORNAMENTAL SHRUBS AND HERBS/ COMMON ORNAMENTAL GRASSES/ ESTABLISHING LAWNS

Lesson Outcome: At the end of this lesson, the student will identify some ornamental shrubs and herbs grown in Fiji.

Distinguish among the three grass families and identify some ornamental grasses. Discuss methods used to establish lawns.

Notes:

Shrubs and herbs are commonly planted as ornamentals. Flowering shrubs provide a long-lived, low-fuss, eye-fetching framework in any garden design with their rich array of form, foliage, fruit and flowers.

Ornamental grasses add color, flowers and texture to an area. There are five families of grasses which are primarily used in ornamental grass gardening. Grasses, sedges and rushes are ornamental plants which add color, flowers and texture to an area

Before lawns are established, the site must be cleared, finely tilled, leveled and fertilizing material applied. Once a site has been prepared, lawn can be established.
