NOVEL: Title: The Silent One Author: Joy Cowley

Setting – Time

- Late 19th Century to mid-20th Century in the Pacific as elements of superstition and physical settings such as the structured bures (old thatched houses) by the beach, the livelihood of villagers and early European Contact are evidence in the story to support this time frame.
- However, the events and lessons read and learnt in the story are timeless.

Setting - Physical

Jonasi's village

- An island in the South Pacific during early European Contact times.
- A village by the sea thatched roof houses along white sandy beaches and palm trees
- A lagoon with abundance of marine food
- Mountain slopes with waterfall
- Pigs, chicken running in the village

Setting - Social Background

- Traditional village with a chief (Taruga Vueti) as its headman.
- Heavily dependent on fishing and hunting as a means of livelihood.
- Superstitious as villagers blamed Jonasi's disability for the drought and hurricane that followed. They believed that his speech and hear impairment was the devil in disguise.

The village was devastatingly affected by the hurricane.
