Topic: Dictionary

It is a book or electronic resource that gives information on particular subjects or on a particular class of words, names, or facts that is usually arranged alphabetical order.

The dictionary provides us with the following;

- The meanings of words.
- Adjective, adverb, verb and noun forms of words.
- The short form of words too which is also known as abbreviations. <u>How to</u>

use a dictionary?

When you are looking for the words in a dictionary, you should start from A - Z (alphabetically) and make sure to follow the sequence up till you find the word you are looking for.


An example of a dictionary extract

bent 0- /bent/ adj., noun → see also BEND

adj. 1 •¬ not straight: a piece of bent wire ⋄ Do this exercise with your knees bent (= not with your legs straight).
 ⇒ picture at CURVED 2 •¬ (of a person) not able to stand up straight, usually as a result of being old or ill/sick: a small bent old woman ⋄ He was bent double with laughter.
 3 (BrE, informal) (of a person in authority) dishonest

'bent on sth/on doing sth determined to do sth (usually sth bad): She seems bent on making life difficult for me.
See also HELL-BENT get bent out of 'shape (about/over sth) (NAME, informal) to become angry, anxious or upset: Don't get bent out of shape about it. It was just a mistake!

■ noun [usually sing.] ~ (for sth) a natural skill or interest in sth: She has a bent for mathematics.



CHANCE



Probability - is the chance that something will happen. It tells us how likely an event will occur.

Impossible - means there is no chance that an event will happen. It will never happen.

Unlikely - means there's a small chance that an event will happen.

Likely - means there's a big chance that an event will happen.

Certain - means there's a 100% chance that an event will happen. It is sure to happen.
