POETRY

A poem is a piece of writing that uses imaginative words to share ideas, emotions, tell a story, or make a sound with the reader. Many poems have words or phrases that sound good together when they are read aloud. Most poems have rhyme or have rhythm (just like music) or repetition.

Poetry is so important because it helps us understand and appreciate the world around us.

Elements of Poetry

- Line – a group of words arranged in a row.
- Stanza – a group of lines within a poem. Like a paragraph in an essay.
- Rhyme – words with same or similar ending sound. Example: Owl - Towel
- Rhythm – the beat and pattern of the poem.
- Repetition - lines or words that are repeated. Example: nibble, nibble, nibble.

Figurative Language In Poetry

1. Simile – comparing using ‘like’ or ‘as’. Example: He was as slow as a snail.
2. Metaphor - Compare two different things without using ‘as’ or ‘like’. Example: Flowers were candy to my eyes.
3. Personification – Giving human character to something that is not human. Example: The cat and dog read their book quietly.
4. Onomatopoeia – Sounds like the noise or action. Example: Boom! Boom!
5. Alliteration – Repeating beginning sounds. Example: Peter Piper picked a pepper.

Measurement Standard Unit to Measure Weight and Mass

Mass – is the weight of any object.



- Grams (g) is used to weigh light objects.
- Kilograms (kg) is used to weigh heavy objects.

- Note:

$$1000 = 1\text{kg}$$

$$500\text{g} = \frac{1}{2}\text{kg}$$

$$250\text{g} = \frac{1}{4}\text{kg}$$

Budget and Credit

A. What is budget?

- ❖ Budget is the process of creating a plan to spend your money.
- ❖ It is simply balancing your **expenses** with your **income**.
- ❖ **Income** – is the money received from the work that you do. (salary)
- ❖ **Expenses** – is the amount of money that you spend.

Why is Having a Budget Important?

- ❖ Having a budget allows you to determine in advance whether you will have enough money to do the things you need to do or would like to do.
- ❖ It ensures that you will have enough money for the things you need and the things that are important to you.
- ❖ Keep you out of debt.
- ❖ Helps you to have control over your money.
- ❖ To help you plan for the future.
- ❖ To help you save money.

B. What is Credit?

- ❖ Credit is the system of doing business by trusting that a customer will pay at a later date for goods or services supplied.
- ❖ Items can be brought through credit.
- ❖ One way of buying things on credit is called **Hire Purchase**.
- ❖ **Hire Purchase**- is a payment method that enables the payment to be spread overtime.
- ❖ **In Instalments** - where the buyer will pay the balance plus the interest in instalments.
- ❖ When buying on hire purchase, you will have to pay an amount of money as a deposit for the items that you are buying and then you can take the item home.

Advantage of Hire Purchase

- ❖ Instead of paying a lump sum of money, you can spread the cost of the item over a period of time.
- ❖ The buyer can use the goods while paying for it.
- ❖ Allows people to buy expensive items.
- ❖ Goods are under guarantee during the hire purchase period.
- ❖ Customers can enjoy higher standard of living
