LESSON NOTES - MIGRATION

- <u>Migration</u> is the movement of people from one place to another. The movement can be temporary or permanent. In Fiji there is internal and external migration.
- **Internal migration** involves the movement of people from islands to islands:

w Rural to rural

w Urban to urban

- Migration can be <u>forced</u>. Those moved voluntarily could be looking for better opportunities like better land, higher education, and better facilities etc. Those who are forced to move could be the result of conflicts, unstable governments, lease expiring etc.
- External Migration involves the movement from Fiji to other overseas countries like Australia, NZ, USA and Canada.

Why do some people return to Fiji after they have migrated?

• Very few returns and some of the reasons are: - Racial tension in the new area. - They have earned sufficient money to return. - To be reunited with their families. - The causes of their migration have been removed. - Better opportunities in their source countries and retirement

Push and Pull factors of migration

Push factors	Pull factors
- Lack of employment - Poor living conditions	- Many type of job opportunities
- Lack of good agricultural land	- Better facilities for higher education
- Conflicts in the family over land	- Better medical facilities
- Low grade facilities in the rural schools	- Facilities for varieties of job opportunities
- Poor medical facilities	- Young people are attracted to the bright lights.
	- Peer pressure
