Resource Interpretation Exercises:

Resource I: Use the following resource to answer Questions (i)-(ii).



- (i) Identify the law depicted in the above newspaper headline and explain its implications on the Jewish people of Germany.

Answer: Nuremberg Law, it took away the rights of German citizenship from the Jews living in Germany.

- (ii) How did the above situation affect the demography of population change in Palestine?

Answer: This led to an increasing number of Jew fleeing from Germany and settling into Palestine as they considered it to be their promised land and to escape the persecution from the Nazi regime in Germany.

Resource II: Use the following resource to answer Questions (iii)-(iv).



The British Prime Minister promises that there will be peace in their time after returning to London from the Munich Conference.

- (iii) Name the British prime minister in the above photograph and identify the document he is holding in his hand.

Answer: Neville Chamberlain, he is holding the Munich Act

- (iv) Briefly explain what did he mean when he said “there would be peace in our time” and state as to what extent his version of peace was materialized?

Answer: He felt that he had succeeded in appeasing Hitler by making him sign the Munich Act promising peace, therefore preventing a possible war. However, his version of peace was never to be since Hitler broke all his promises and continued his acts of aggressions leading to the failure of appeasement.

Resource III: Use the following resource to answer Questions (v)-(vi).



- (v) Name the 3 countries which were prominent enemies of the Allies.

Answer: The Axis Powers – Germany, Italy and Japan

- (vi) By making close reference to the map, give a reason for the victory of the Allies.

Answer: Geographical isolation where each Axis Power was distanced from each other and the Balance of Power, especially with the entry of the USA on the side of the Allies brought victory to them.
